CASK BAR

Battersea Brewery, The Arches, Circus West, Battersea Power Station, SW11

- 1. The Old and the Dead 4.2%** A Traditional "Old" ale.
- 2. La Monde Saison 6.0%** A saison sour beer for all those that keep asking me to have one at the festival. Now please be sure to drink. As I do not want half the cask left
- 3. Blonde Citra 5%** Had a good session on this the night of the James Bond Premier. Excellent drinking pale bitter with the distinctive sharpness the Citra hop imparts
- 4. Juicy IPA 6%**
- 5. Coffee Stout 6.0%**

Beerblefish, Edmonton, London

- 6. Edmonton Best Bitter 4.3%** A beer inspired by the the Edmonton "home" of Beerblefish. Using the English Archer hop variety which gives a rich stone fruit note to the beer.
- 7. Blackbeerble Stout 5.2%** One of the first brews to come out of Bearish. Mellow chocolatey taste due to base of chocolate malt and chocolate wheat
- 8. 1820 Porter 6.6%** A beer that would not have been out of place in an early nineteenth century porterhouse and at 6.6% ABV is about on the mark for the time. This porter is full of chocolate and coffee notes and based on an 1800s recipe. Smooth, rich flavour. A former Wandsworth Common best beer at festival winner. Hopefully it will have arrived as was still in the fermenter at the time of going to press.

Brunswick Brewery, Derby

- 9. Rocket 4.7%** Pale IPA with Aussie & US hops. Apricot and Citrus notes
- 10. Black Sabbath 6%** Multi award winning strong dark ale with liquorice notes.

By the Horns, Summerstown, Wandsworth

- 11. Stiff Upper Lip 3.8%** Amber coloured well balanced with citrus and honey notes
- 12. Solid Gold Easy Action 4.5%** On Saturday 18th September a blue plaque was unveiled to commemorate the fact that Marc Bolan lived in 13. Summerstown SW17 on the site where we began our brewery in 2011.
Following a fantastic event at the the brewery with tributes from family members, fans and other musicians we brewed a special one off beer for this momentous occasion
- 14. Lambeth Walk 5.1%** Black Porter a hint of sweetness matched with roasted bitterness.

Downton Salisbury, Wiltshire

Long time supplier to the Wandsworth Common Festival Martin Strawbridge is at the forefront of modern cask brewing and has stayed loyal to cask preferring not to go down the route of keg like so many other brewers. Instead, his ever changing seasonal range, plus core favourites, remain faithful to traditional beer production methods and techniques.

- 15. Quadhop 3.9%** Pale in colour, with five varieties of hops!
Challenger, East Kent Goldings, Pioneer, Mosaic and Styrian Goldings hops

16. Elderquad 4.0% Hints of sweetness and a subtle elderflower aroma offer a terrific balance to the hops.

17. Honey Blonde 4.3% Straw coloured golden ale. Fresh and fruity light ale made with real honey.

18. Downton Dream 4.8% Pilsner-style ale brewed with Slovenian Celeia and Dana hops. Unique floral aroma and light fruity sweetness.

19. Moonstruck, 5.5% A complex, dark brown ale combining subtle coffee and chocolate flavours with a rich, hoppy aroma.

20. Chocolate Orange Delight 5.8% A long time festival favourite and previous winner of “Best in Wandsworth”. Enriched with a bottle of Cointreau in every brew

Frome Brewing, Frome, Somerset

21. Funky Monkey 4.0% English Pale Ale. Light amber colour. Aroma of ripe mango and freshly squeezed grapefruit on the nose thanks to Citra and Mosaic in the hop mix.

22. Gulp IPA 4.8% This light, amber-coloured English style IPA Light notes of peach and grapefruit

Harveys, Lewes, Sussex

23. Harveys Sussex Best 4.0% Superbly balanced bitter with prominent hop character. The brew has evolved over decades before settling on its current formula. Finest Maris Otter malted barley is supplemented with a dash of Crystal malt for balance. A blend of four different local varieties give a distinctive hoppy finish. Winner of the Champion Best Bitter of Britain title at CAMRA’s Great British Beers Festival in 2005 and 2006.

24. Old 4.3% Soft and full-bodied, with hints of dried fruits and dates. Rich, dark and warming. Available only in the autumn and winter months

25. Star of Eastbourne 5.5% This golden IPA exudes a full hop aroma, with subtle hints of marmalade. The crisp bitterness lingers on the palate giving a dry finish. Only available in October

Keltic Brewery, Redruth, Cornwall

26. Lance 4% Golden ale. Grassy citrus hops. Hint of elderflower and butterscotch on the very finish.

Red Cat Brewing, Winchester, Hampshire

27. Scratch 4.0% Pale golden bitter. with long fruit aftertaste

28. South Island 4.2% Very pale session beer with a high percentage of oats in the grist. Cloudy, very soft and smooth mouthfeel, delicate citrus aroma from the Motueka hops.

29. Mr & Mrs Porter 4.5% With four traditional English roasted malts, this award winning complex beer gives aromas of chocolate, vanilla and mellow coffee. Full in the mouth and surprisingly easy to drink. CAMRA Champion Porter of Britain 2018.

Sandstone Brewery, Wrexham, Wales

30. American Proper Gander 4.1% No I didn’t get it at first either. Try saying it quicker. An American pale ale.

31. Postmistress 4.4% Full bodied best bitter. Ruby red /chestnut colour. Long satisfying taste. One for Klaudia to sample.

St. Georges Brewery, Essex

32. Wicked Witch 3.6% One to start the festival with. Session easy drinking light copper coloured ale.

33. Poltergeist 4.6% Golden ale with a blend of UK and US hops

Sambrook's, Wandsworth London SW18

What can you say about this wonderful brewer who started as Young's left us. Then lost their Yelverton Road brewery to developers only to be offered the Heritage Brewery site on the old Young's site. Truly a Phoenix from the ashes story.

34. Winter Warmer 6%. John Hatch ex Young's Brewer has produced this one-off nano brew as homage to the once great Young's Winter Warmer. Back at a strength nearer the original before they started to mess about with the ABV and eventually produce a beer that was nothing like the original.

Sarah Hughes Brewery Sedgley, Dudley

36. Dark Ruby Mild 6.0% A former winner of Best in Festival. Wonderfully eccentric, extremely drinkable 6% mild . Uniquely flavoured due to use of a Victorian open topped copper. As usual we sent a van all the way to Dudley to collect this. When asked what your favourite record, film, or beer is, it is usually quite hard to decide. But in my case this is the best beer in the World. Now and always.

38. Broken Dream An indulgence of chocolate and speciality malts, Broken Dream is smooth, unctuous and moreish. It's brewed with milk sugar for balance and mouthfeel, along with carefully selected espresso from London's Climpson & Sons. Awarded CAMRA Supreme Champion Beer of Britain 2018.

Southbourne Brewing, Bournemouth, Dorset

Founder and Head Brewer Jennifer Tingay set up Southbourne brewing in 2013 after 7 years at Ringwood Brewery. The brewery markets itself as 2 breweries. The traditional beer from Southbourne and the go-ahead modern craft brewer Tingay

39. Sunbather 4.0% Rich Ruby red beer with hints of toffee and orange

40. Grockles 4.5% Blonde beer, with peachy overtones imparted by USA hops.

41. Armed with Flowers 4.5% A pink beer!!! Yes, not dark not brown black amber or blonde. Its PINK. Infused with hibiscus flowers. Fruity, sweet and zesty. (MUST TRY)

Tiny Rebel, Wales

42. Peloton Pale 4.2% Session pale ale, A floral and grassy aroma with a spicy, lime taste.

Titanic, Burslem, Stoke On Trent

43. Cherry Dark 4.4% Super smooth, fruity ale combining the sweetness of cherries with the nuttiness of a dark beer. Superb. Lightly hopped dark red, fruity beer. The powerful, sweet cherry taste cuts through create some sort of cherry Bakewell tart taste.

44. Chocolate & Vanilla Stout 4.5% Choctastic beer. Made with real coffee real vanilla pods. Plus almonds, a drop of sherrypluy and some cocoa powder. As the GBG puts it "Heaven in a Glass" Could be a Best in Festival contender. MUST TRY

45. Raspberry Pale 4.7% Raspberry Pale is a strong, fruity pale wheat beer with bags of flavour. This wonderfully fruity wheat beer is refreshingly and light. The raspberry flavours bounce off the hops perfectly to result in a unique, balanced beer.

46. Plum Porter 4.9% A festival favourite here and everywhere. Much copied but never quite equalled. Dark brown. Manages to marry the sweetness of the plums to the bitterness of the beer that no other fruity beer has ever managed.

47. Grand Reserve Plum Porter 6.5% *Still in fermenter at time of going to Press. so please ask server if it has actually arrived.* Based on the multi-award winning Plum Porter, Grand Reserve is a darker, stronger special edition beer produced in very limited volumes in the winter. Its matured in conditioning tanks for 21 days. The longer process and added strength gives this beer an even deeper, richer flavour. The perfect fireside pint on a dark, winter's night!

Titsey Brewery, Titsey, Surrey

48. Gower Wolf 4.0% Best Bitter with a honey and cocoa aroma. Long finish . The beer names all relate to former owners of the Titsey Estate. This micro brewery established in 2017 currently operates from the Botley Hill Farmhouse. These 3 beers are available for the first time in London, normally only being available in a tight circle of Firehouses in the Surrey area.

49. Gresham Hopper 3.7% English Pale Ale with citrus, pine and tropical fruit aromas

50. Leveson Buck 3.7% An IPA Dry hopped with Simcoe which gives the passion fruit aroma you should be getting.

Wantsum Brewery, relocated to St. Nicholas Court Farm, Wade, Kent *The brewery was founded by 2 long serving but disgruntled Greene King employees who have gone from strength to strength with a policy of core beers and a a very wide (maybe too wide) range of specials and seasonals. Highly recommended.*

51. Turbulent Priest 4.4% Brewed to celebrate the 200th year of Crabble Corn Mill, this beer is named after the red paint used on the mill stones. A 5 Hop, ruby red premium bitter with biscuit and toasted malt base supporting a broad hoppy smooth finish.

52. Hurricane 4.5% A refreshing IPA brewed with Mosaic & Citra Hops, this beer packs a Citrus Punch, Oats in the Mash give a smooth mouthfeel and plenty of body. Adopted by Spurs fans in the Kent/Sussex borders who order it as "Harry Kane".

53. Golgotha 5.5% A rich, deep and broad malt base gives this stout a very long smooth finish with plenty of oats for added body and creaminess. Hops are prominent on the nose with blackcurrant, liquorice and cedar.

54. Grim Reaper 5.5% Ruby Red Rye IPA brewed with plenty of Simcoe & Chinook hops. The Rye helps give light spice notes and added body

Wimbledon Brewery, London SW19

54. London Porter 4.8% Porter with an aroma of chocolate, coffee and red fruit and hints of spice with a smooth finish.

55. Quartermaine IPA 5.8% The ultimate English IPA, personally brewed by Master Brewer Derek Prentice. Derek called on all his 50 years' brewing experience to create this stunning beer. The fruity, spicy, floral hop aromas lead to a full, rich, almost light fruit cake middle palate, ending with a clean dry bitter finish.

56. XXXK Vintage Ale 10% 4 years in cask Barley Wine

Woodeforde's Norfolk

57. Wherry 3.8% Amber bitter. Champion Beer of Britain

58. Nelson 4.5% Copper coloured. Wandsworth common organiser gets very annoyed if Trafalgar Day, October 21st is not properly observed. As its his birthday. Pays homage to Admiral Nelson and his crew. A Norfolk beer, for a Norfolk hero.

59. Nog 4.8% Deep ruby colour. Champion Winter Beer of Britain x 2. Also WBA World's best Old Ale. (Must try)

XT Brewing, Long Crendon, Bucks

60. Aardvark 4.6% Brewed with all pale malt with more hop varieties than an aardvarks tongue. Showcases English Jester hops. Packed with floral, herbal and stone fruit flavours with tropical notes scattered throughout.

61. Lion 4.6% Classic full bodied London Porter, brewed with a traditional recipe and re-engineered London Water. Rich, dark character matched with a toasty aroma and a hint of sweet earthy notes.

The KEG Bar

The beers will rotate throughout the festival

Battersea Brewery, Battersea Power Station, SW11

K62 Velvet Nitro Coffee Stout 4.7% Quite the most exceptional beer I have tasted this year at this low (for me) gravity. MUST TRY. Extreme coffee infusion creating a cold pint of black coffee beer. .

K63 Imperial Stout 12.5% Block buster dark stout which was premiered in August at the LBA festival. This batch has benefited from a 6 month ageing.

Beavertown, Tottenham Hale, N.17

K64 Neck Oil 4.3% Started life as a home-brew. The name Neck Oil comes from founder, Logan, remembering his Grandad stating that he was "off down the pub for a pint of neck oil". An 'easy' IPA.

K65 Bones Lager 4.4% Bones, is the new lager from Beavertown. Crisp and refreshing. Make no Bones about it, this lager is dead refreshing, dead crisp, and most importantly, dead good.

K66 Gamma Ray 5.4% A juicy tropical beer. day, rammed with juicy malts and huge tropical aromas of mango and grapefruit. Massive additions of American hops are added to the whirlpool giving huge hop flavour. The beer is then dry hopped.

Brixton Brewery, Brixton, London SW9

Only started in 2013 in a railway arch in Brixton Market. Sensationally benefitted from massive inward investment from mega brewers Heineken in 2017 which allowed for new plant and expansion into nearby Industrial Park.

K67 Coldharbour Lager 4.5% This Pilsner style beer, with Bohemian origins is unfiltered, unpasteurised and vegan (as are all Brixton brewery products) Crisp, clean and floral.

K 68 Reliance Pale Ale 4.2% Named after the art deco arches of Reliance Arcade where local cobblers and tailors still practice their crafts. Premium English Maris Otter Barley provides the clean, crisp backdrop to bright hop flavours. Pale Ale – Biscuity malts, pine aromas and citrus flavours. An easy drinking beer for all occasions.

K69 Atlantic A.P.A. 5.4% Brixton's famous street market winds down Atlantic Road. A deluge of aroma hops after the boil and generous dry hopping deliver a juicy tropical flavour. Extra Pale malt keeps it crisp and lets the hops rule. American Pale Ale – Bursts of citrus and tropical fruit. Bold, modern and refreshing.

Double Barrelled, Reading, Berkshire

K70 Ding Lager 4.9% Unfiltered, unpasteurised and naturally hazy Keller Lager. Classic German malt profile paired with Hallertau Mittelfruh and Perle hops for a clean, bready and crisp Lagerbier.

(Cloudy as f**k - Lord Battersea)

De Hoorn Brewery, Belgium

K71 Estaminet Refined Lager 5.2% High quality lager with a contemporary taste. Since its launch, in 2008 it has received several prestigious awards. A lager with soft floral notes, a slightly spicy hop character and a unique fruity fermentation aroma.

Emilisse, Netherlands.

Awarded with a place in the top 100 best beer brewers of the world at No.19, Emilisse has been an established name in the world off craft beer for more than 10 years.

K72 Imperial Russian Stout 11%% Russian Stout which has aged for exactly 15 weeks on whisky barrels. This exclusive brew is characterized by notes of walnut, coffee and chocolate. The barrel aging process gave this beer a wonderful peated touch, which ultimately results in an alcohol-warming aftertaste.

K73 Barrel aged barley wine 12.5% Sledgehammer barley wine aged in Scotch whisky barrels

Fremont, Seattle USA

K74 Golden Pilsner Lager 4.5 A yellow Pilsner lager style. White wheat, and acidulated malt with Czech Saaz hops.

Aroma of honey, lemon, honeysuckle, grassy Flavour of moderate sweetness with a light bitterness and a crisp, light body

Kompaan Brewery, Hague, Netherlands
K75 DNEIPA 8%

La Trappe, Berkel-Enschot, Netherlands

K76 Dubbel 7.0% Rarely available on draught in the UK this dubbel is a Trappist ale. Dark Brown colour with ivory head. Taste of vanilla, chocolate, caramel, dates, honey and dried fruits. Massive flavour

Lervig, Norway

K77 Sweet Wheat 4.5% This ultra-refreshing American Wheat Beer has all the extra pale cloudiness and drinkability of a Hefeweizen, but without any of the clove, nutmeg or banana flavours of its Bavarian cousin. Built upon a malt base of 60% wheat/40% Pilsner, it is soft bodied with a cereal character of biscuits and a gentle mouthfeel. The classic combination of Mosaic, Citra and Cascade hops used in the whirlpool contributes to a light fruit/citrus quality on the palate, however this beer is not dry hopped, so it's far from "hoppy". The finish is crisp with a light sweetness that invites sip after sip, and the medium carbonation allows the creamy, white head to linger. Squirt in a wedge of orange or lemon into your Sweet Wheat

Moretti, Udine, Italy

K78 Moretti L'Authentica 4.6% Luigi Moretti's "Beer and ice factory" was founded in Udine in 1859 the same year as the Royal Victoria Patriotic Building was built. Distributed in the UK by Heineken.

Poesiat En Kater, Amsterdam, Netherlands

K79 Barrel Aged Stout 7.1%

K80 Immaculate Spiced Ale 5.7%

Rodenbach, Belgium

K81 FruitAge 3.9% Technically a sour but thankfully has a delightful fruity taste. Made from a 2 year old cask matured ale added to red fruits. Try drinking with a slice of lime. Much more approachable and therefore appreciated than beers of a similar style. **Highly recommended.**

Tiny Rebel, Newport, Wales

K82 Key Lime Lager 4.8% A twist of Key Lime in this new Lager. Refreshing Citrus wrapped up in a mouth watering lager beer base.

K83 Imperial Stay Puft Eggnog 9% This white marshmallow porter has the classic roasty qualities of a proper dark ale, whilst the marshmallow gives it a smooth sweetness, both combining for a delightfully sweet ale.

This is the most eagerly awaited beer from Lord Battersea's point of view. Could be a festival winner.

Titsey, Surrey

K84 Innes Lager 4.0% Light floral refreshing properly layered (aged) Saaz and Hallertau

Uitje, Netherlands

K85 Citrus Blonde 5.0% Pale Ale - Belgian style beer brewed by Brouwerij het Uiltje in Haarlem, Netherlands

K86 Imperial Milk Stout 10% A product of blending 2 beers. One an 18% Ice distilled Monster IPA blended with Grandpa's Caffeine Fix, a 10% Irish Coffee Imperial Milk stout. For head bangers only

Westmalle, Antwerp, Belgium

The Trappist Abbey of Westmalle, near Antwerp, has been brewing beer for over 150 years. One of only 10 breweries in the world permitted to carry the Authentic Trappist Product label, it is regarded as being responsible for the increasing popularity of Trappist beers.

K87 Westmalle Dubbel 7.0% Outstanding Trappist beer. Rich and complex. This dark brown Belgian dubbel has beautiful ruby undertones with a creamy, fragrant head. Aromas of dark fruits, bread, and subtle spices lead the way for flavours of raisins and other dark fruits and a fresh bitter finish that lingers long and dry.

White Hag, Sligo, Ireland

K88 Rye Barley Wine 13% Rich honey & caramel Notes with a touch of vanilla followed by intense fig and dark fruit, port like character.

Wild Beer

The Wild Beer Co was born in 2012 out of a love of fermentation, barrel-ageing and most importantly, flavour. Known for producing a range of eclectic and diverse beers delivering big flavours which are extremely accessible.

K89 Strawberry Line 6.5% Celebrating the Somerset terroir, loaded with 800kg of local strawberries, added to a barrel aged local grape fermented sour beer. Crisp, bright and full of strawberry deliciousness.
