CASK BAR

1. Arbor, Bristol

Rocketman 6.0% Full flavoured American IPA, Mosaic and Citra hops. It has big tropical fruit flavours of mango, passion fruit, lychee & sweet grapefruit.

2. Bason Bridge, Somerset

Founded in February 2018 Bason Bridge Brewing company sits in the heart of Somerset. Brewing on a 12 barrel plant with open top fermenters the brewery currently produces 3 beers under the Hardings label. Avalon Pale Ale 4.3% A British-style pale ale that pours a glowing orange shade with a pronounced head. Cascade and Challenger provide a lightly hopped aroma with some grassy notes. The flavour is smooth and inviting.

Beerblefish, Edmonton, London

Committed to keeping their beers vegan. They do not include isinglass or other animal products in any beer – they believe additives do not add anything to the taste of the beer and simply stop some people from being able to enjoy it. They also don't add other ingredients to their beers that are derived from animal products, such as honey and lactose.

3. Edmonton Best Bitter 4.3% Å modern best bitter featuring British malts and an international line-up of hops.

4. Hoppy Pale Ale No.23 4.5% A series of pale ales, all around the same ABV, which showcase new and different hops while maintaining a consistent pale malt base.

5. Storm Cloud 4.6% A dark ale with subtle fruity European hop combination

6. 1820 Porter 6.6% This porter is full of chocolate and coffee notes and based on an 1800s recipe. Roasted malts have been avoided for this ale, instead loading in the chocolate malt and wheat, giving it a smooth, rich flavour.

7. S.M.A.S.H. Organic Pale Ale (5.2%) - Single hopped with a generous amount of Citra.

Black Iris Brewery, Nottinghamshire

8. Snake Eyes 3.8% Flagship hoppy pale ale. Coming in at an extremely drinkable low gravity. Packed full of juicy tropical notes followed by a lovely citrus kick coming from the blend of Citra and Cascade hops in both the boil and the dry hopping stage.

Billericay Brewery, Essex

9. Zeppelin 3.8% Amber session bitter with slight smoky notes.

Brentwood Brewery, Essex

10. Falcon Punch 5.1% An IPA with fruity hoppy punch, low in bitterness and very refreshing.

Brunswick Brewery, Derby

11. Ubiquitous 6.0% A single hop pale generously hopped with Citra hops. Big tropical & citrus flavours.

Cloudwater, Manchester

Founded in 2014, This cutting edge Manchester brewer has in their short history made hundreds of different beers in styles old and new, classical and imagined, evolving their brewing skills and trialling fermentation and process changes in pursuit of ever higher-quality beer. 12. Happy Golden Ale 3.7%

Cotswold Lion, Gloucestershire

13. Drovers Return 5.0% Ruby coloured premium bitter, full of malt and fruit flavours.

Downton Salisbury, Wiltshire

Long time supplier to the Wandsworth Common Festival Martin Strawbridge is at the forefront of modern cask brewing and has stayed loyal to cask preferring not to go down the route of keg like so many other brewers. Instead, his ever changing seasonal range, plus core favourites, remain faithful to traditional beer production methods and techniques.

14. Mad Hare 3.9% This auburn coloured speciality bitter is bursting with rich resinous hop flavours. Ginger and lemongrass add a spicy citrus bite to this spring favourite.

15. Elderquad 4.0% A pale, generously-hopped session beer. Hints of sweetness and a subtle elderflower aroma.

16. Honey Blonde 4.3% Straw coloured golden ale. Fresh and fruity light ale made with real honey.

17. Moonstruck 5.5% Dark ruby ale with subtle coffee and chocolate flavours and a rich, hoppy aroma. Roasted berry and caramel characters sink deep into a fantastic bitter finish.

18. Chocolate Orange 5.8% A long time festival favourite and previous winner of Best in Wandsworth" Enriched with a bottle of Cointreau in every brew

19. Chimera IPA 6.8% A traditional India Pale Ale, brewed with a hugely increased hop rate for a strong, floral aroma, and a powerful, bitter taste.

Downton Brewery Chimera IPA is a truly classic IPA bursting with resinous hoppy flavours that packs quite a punch - just as a traditional IPA should.

Elephant School Brewery, Essex

Elephant School Brewing is named after the Elephant School that was in the Essex Regiment army barrack, which was a depot for the Essex Regiment. The school was run by the British East India Trading Company and ran until 1959.

20. Aussie Blonde 4.0% As the name suggest a cool blonde ale

Gloucester Brewery, Gloucestershire

21. Gloucester Gold 3.9% A signature, multi-award winning golden ale, crisp, fruity and pleasantly bitter with a beautiful aroma of luscious tropical fruit.

This beer is unfiltered, it will contain live yeast and pour hazy.

Godalming Beer Works, Surrey

Brewing started at The Star on Church street in Godalming, the site of a tavern since 1832 it remains largely unaltered with all its 'Olde Worlde' character and charm. Highly recommended as a day out 22. Ravenscroft Best 4.1% Ravenscroft was the name given to the location where the first brew took place. A secret location in Godalming where if you time it right on a summer evening you can still spot the occasional Raven overhead.

23. First Light 5.0% An American APA First Light was created to celebrate the world's first public electricity supply being installed in Godalming in 1881.

First Light is inspired by west coast American Pale Ales with a dry hop dose of Nelson Sauvin that brings loads of tropical fruit flavour.

24. Pepperpot Porter 6.7% The Pepperpot is one of Godalming's most iconic landmarks, right in the middle of town new visitors often wonder why such a strangely shaped building exists. The current building was erected in 1814 and has served as the Town hall as well as the home for the weekly market. Pepperpot Porter includes coconut and vanilla in the recipe to create a porter that is rich but smooth. MUST TRY

Hadham Brewery, Little Hadham, Herts

25. Gold 3.7% A gently hoppy Citrus character which is slightly bitter in body with a sweetness developing. The aroma is pleasantly floral with notes of lemon and pine. Brewed with pure spring water, Maris Otter barley and Challenger, and Bobek hops.

Harveys, Lewes, Sussex

The oldest independent brewery in Sussex. A family business, the brewery has been in the guardianship of seven generations of John Harvey's descendants since 1790, with five family members from the seventh and eighth generations currently working here.

Still a privately-owned limited company, Harvey's remarkably has no shares marketed for external investment.

26. Dark Mild 3.0% Malty and Mellow. Soft and slightly sweet with a dry, nutty aftertaste akin to an infusion of ground nuts. Dark Mild accounted for 75% of beer produced during the decade following the Second World War and was the mainstay of a generation in the public bar. But today few breweries produce a top flight dark mild. Thankfully, Harveys brew this all year round making it one of the very few regularly produced Milds in the South of England

27. Porter 4.8% A complex, dark and full-bodied beer with prominent roasted malts, reminiscent of date sugars, and a restrained fruitiness.

Porter is brewed to Henry Harvey's recipe of 1859, this beer is an authentic recreation of a Victorian Porter. Pale, crystal and black malts combine with a generous hop grist of Fuggles and Goldings to produce a full, rounded palate with roasted malts to the fore.

28. Old 4.3% Soft and full-bodied, with hints of dried fruits and dates. Rich, dark and warming. Available only in the autumn and winter months.

29. Easter Ale 6.8% ***NEW BEER*** A full bodied amber ale that balances sweet malt sugars with the aroma and bitterness of Fuggle, Pilgrim, Cascade and Golding hops. It is brewed with fresh spring water from the South Downs, in celebration of the Easter Holiday. Do not leave festival without drinking this, or the beer below.

30. Prince of Denmark 7.5% One of the great beers of the World and rarely available on draught even in Harveys tied houses. A strong, dark beer of great complexity and depth. Brown, amber and black malts are mixed with pale ale malts to give this beer its strong aroma and colouring. MUST TRY

Hop Kettle, Swindon, Wiltshire

31. Element 4.2% A hoppy English pale ale GLUTEN FREE

Iron Pier, Gravesend, Kent

32. Joined at the Hop 3.8% A light golden ale, with a hint of grainy malts as a backdrop to two combined hops

33. Export India Porter 5.9% This is a bigger version of their straight Porter recipe with the addition of a punchy Chinook, Centennial and Columbus dry hop. Delicious and complex flavours of roasted malt, coffee, chocolate, with a dry hoppy finish. MUST TRY

34. 90/- Shillings 5.9% Full bodied Scottish Wee Heavy ale. Warming rich malty flavour with a hint of caramel, a subtle hoppy bitterness, and a smooth, slightly sweet finish. " My kind of beer" - Lord Battersea "Must try"

Listers Brewery, Patching, West Sussex

35.Listers Springtime 3.8% A Spring beer for a Spring festival. Slight tropical fruity aroma36. Listers Best Bitter 3.9% Amber coloured beer. Sometimes, just sometimes all you want is a good honest pint. This is it

37. Listers Tail Wagger 4.1% Ochre pale ale. Brewed specially to support a dog charity foundation.

Mad Cat Brewery, Brogdale Farm, Brogdale Road, Faversham, Kent 38. Platinum Blonde 4.2% Very light coloured ale, Platinum Blonde is made with a single variety of very pale lager malts and with a noticeable lemony citrus aroma from Cascade hops. Chills nicely for a refreshing alternative to lager. Neon Raptor Brewing, Sneinton Market, Nottinghamshire

39. Verve 4.2% IPA No description available at time of going to Press. But sure to be superb from this cutting edge brewer who only started brewing on their own equipment in 2018. All beers are unfiltered, unpasteurised and unfined (....and therefore, "unfinished" according to Lord Battersea)

Pentrich, Derbyshire

40. Limit the Stars 5.2% Citra hopped Pale ale.

Redemption, Tottenham, London

Our glass sponsor this year is Redemption, one of the pioneering founders of London's craft beer movement and was the first brewery in Tottenham, North London in almost 100 years. Started back in 2010, the brewery is 100% independently owned and brew beers brimming with flavour and complexity. Their Match Day Taproom is open for every weekend after the Spurs game where you will find REAL Spurs fans mulling over the madness that is Davidson Sanchez being a professional footballer when he is clearly the WORST EVER signing in the clubs history....or other such topics. The beers are as good now as I remember back in 2010.

41. Trinity 3.0% An award-winning Light Ale brewed with three malts and three hops. Generous late hopping provides Seville orange aromas and the initial malt sweetness is dominated by citrus flavours which explode on the palate. Brewed with plenty of malt to provide decent body, so it has some backbone for a low ABV beer. There's also a pronounced bitterness throughout. Get taste for a low gravity beer 42. Pale 3.8% Golden amber in colour with citrus and some floral hop aromas. Toffee sweetness and citrus fruit flavours are balanced by a floral and earthy hop contribution, with a long dry satisfying bitter finish.

43. Rock the Kazbek 4.0% Blonde ale single hopped with Czech Kazbek hop for refreshing zesty lemon, lime and grapefruit flavours with delicate lemon aroma.

44. Little Chief 4.3% ***NEW BEER- ONE OFF SPECIAL***

45.Hopspur 4.5% Everyone knows this amber ale is really Hotspur in homage to the mighty Spurs whose ground is a 15 minute walk away. Citrus fruit aromas, chewy biscuity malt flavours, slight sticky sweetness and grapefruit piney hop flavours. Well balanced with hop flavours to the fore and an easy bitter finish. SIBA Gold Medal

46. Urban Dusk 4.6% Chestnut coloured Premium Bitter with malts providing coffee aromas and some hazelnut and caramel on the palate, while Bramling Cross hops offer some dark fruit flavours. Citrus notes and an earthy bitterness lasts into the finish.

47. Redemption Extra Special Bitter ESB 5.0%

NEW BEER, ONE-OFF

48. Fellowship Porter 5.1% Dark brown coloured London Porter with chocolate, coffee, liquorice and dry roasted malt flavours complimented with hints of dark fruit. Generous late hopping adds some zest and the initial sweetness fades into a restrained bitter finish. Deceptively drinkable and a SIBA Gold medal winner. Probably the definitive London Porter.

49. Big Chief 5.5% Big hoppy IPA style beer, packed full of Kiwi hops with hints of honey and nectar and plenty of tropical citrus and floral notes. Back in 2010 this was the first mega NZ hopped beer. And it is still the best of its genre often copied but never bettered. MUST TRY

Sambrook's, Wandsworth London SW18

What can you say about this wonderful brewer who started as Young's left us. Then lost their Yelverton Road brewery to developers only to be offered the Heritage Brewery site on the old Young's site. Truly a Phoenix form the ashes story.

50. Ginger Beer 5.0% ***NEW BEER***An experimental one -off beer from John Hatch at Sambrooks made with real root ginger not extract or powder.

51. English IPA ***NEW BEER***A proper English IPA not the bastardised US mega hop high gravity versions that currently abound.

Siren Brewery, Fichampstead, Berkshire

52. Lulu 3.6% Brewed with Earl Grey tea and lemon zest for taste that belies its strength. Distinct peach and apricot notes are complemented by zesty bergamot flavours and a delicate loose leaf tea

bitterness.Unfiltered / Unfined

53. Memento 3.8% A modern best bitter beer style. Expect biscuit and caramel flavours, balanced by English hops with grassy, herbal and citrus notes and refreshing bitterness. Vegan Friendly

Three Acre Brewery

54. Blood Orange Pale 4.9% Blood Orange Pale is an extra-special APA, using US and German hops and real blood orange peel to bring forward juicy, yet finely balanced flavours.

Tiny Rebel, Newport, Wales

55. Hank 4.0% Light US style pale ale with tropical & citrus aromas with low to medium bitterness. Floral flavours with slight caramel and biscuit notes leave the beer well balanced and highly drinkable 56. Rocket Air 4.0% Welsh IPA

57. Cwtch 4.6% Cwtch (rhymes with butch) means a hug full of Love.

Cwtch is an award-winning Welsh Red Ale that is packed full of flavour and rich amber colour. Citra hops to give this traditional style a Tiny Rebel spin.

58. Very Cherry 4.5% Cherry, Amaretto sour red stout

Track Brewing, Manchester 59. Sonoma 3.8% A hazy US style pale ale

Vibrant Forest, Hardley nr. Southampton, Hampshire

A small brewery located in the New Forest National Park. all their beers are unfiltered, unpasteurised and suitable for Vegans

60. Avena 4.5% Triple hopped pale ale, Citra, Ekuanot and Chinook. It's smooth upfront with lashings of tropical fruit and grapefruit. The finish holds a burst of Chinook-borne bitterness

61. Inaudible 5.0% Hazy pale ale with an oat-laden base plus Chinook, Simcoe and Talus hops Fermented on their house yeast, expect a soft mouthfeel with hints of pine, stone fruits and a gentle herbaceous finish.

62. Black Forest Porter 4.9% Very rich, thick, and flavoursome porter, in the style of those brewed in old London. The aroma brings roasted coffee and oak. Dark chocolate, espresso and charred malts follow and the long finale is dark, fruity, and bittersweet. MUST TRY

Vocation Brewery, Yorkshire

63. Naughty & Nice 5.9% A wonderful Yorkshire chocolate stout

Wantsum Brewery, relocated to St. Nicholas Court Farm, Wade, Kent

The brewery was founded by 2 long serving but disgruntled Greene King employees who have gone from strength to strength with a policy of core beers and a a very wide (maybe too wide) range of specials and seasonals. Highly recommended. Wantsum Brewery takes its name from the Wantsum Channel, the watercourse separating the Isle of Thanet from what was the mainland of the English county of Kent. 64. Hurricane 4.5% New World IPA brewed with Mosaic & Citra Hops. Oats in the Mash give a smooth mouthfeel and plenty of body to the Beer.

65. Clerics Consolation 4.5% Belgian trappist style ale.

The KEG Bar

The beers will rotate throughout the festival

Beavertown, Tottenham Hale, N.17

K66 Neck Oil 4.3% Started life as a home-brew. The name Neck Oil comes from founder, Logan, remembering his Grandad stating that he was "off down the pub for a pint of neck oil". An 'easy' IPA. K67. Bones Lager 4.4% Bones, is the new lager from Beavertown. Crisp and refreshing. Make no Bones about it, this lager is dead refreshing, dead crisp, and most importantly, dead good.

K68. Gamma Ray 5.4% A juicy tropical beer. day, rammed with juicy malts and huge tropical aromas of mango and grapefruit. Massive additions of American hops are added to the whirlpool giving huge hop

flavour. The beer is then dry hopped.

Brixton Brewery, Brixton, London SW9

Only started in 2013 in a railway arch in Brixton Market. Sensationally benefitted from massive inward investment from mega brewers Heineken in 2017 which allowed for new plant and expansion into nearby Industrial Park.

K69. Coldharbour Lager 4.5% This Pilsner style beer, with Bohemian origins is unfined, unpasteurised and vegan (as are all Brixton brewery products) Crisp, clean and floral.

K70. Reliance Pale Ale 4.2% Named after the art deco arches of Reliance Arcade where local cobblers and tailors still practice their crafts. Premium English Maris Otter Barley provides the clean, crisp backdrop to bright hop flavours. Pale Ale – Biscuity malts, pine aromas and citrus flavours. An easy drinking beer for all occasions.

K71. Atlantic A.P.A. 5.4% Brixton's famous street market winds down Atlantic Road. A deluge of aroma hops after the boil and generous dry hopping deliver a juicy tropical flavour. Extra Pale malt keeps it crisp and lets the hops rule. American Pale Ale – Bursts of citrus and tropical fruit. Bold, modern and refreshing.

Campus, Belgium

K72. Premium Lager 5.0% A brilliant Belgian pilsner brewed by the legends behind Delirium Tremens. Slightly lemony and dry.

Drop Project, Mitcham, Surrey

An Eco conscious brewery, who attempt to create as little a negative impact on the world as possible when brewing. Spent grain is recycled into local agricultural as animal feed and they have reduced C02 usage in the brewery by 90%. They have a one tree one brew policy, where Drop Project commit to planting a tree for every batch brewed. At their Mitcham Taproom, every 100 pints you drink, they plant one tree

K73. Shifty 5.2% Flagship pale ale K74. Crispy 5.3% West Coast pilsner

Hacker Pschorr, Germany

K75. Munich Gold Lager 5.5% Malt-forward lager from one of Bavaria's beer legends. Making great beer since 1417. Light floral notes supporting delicious bread and biscuit character.

Hudson Valley Brewing, Main Street, Beacon, New York USA K76. Diadem 6.0% A Pale Ale with wheat & oat, brewed & dry hopped exclusively with Nelson Sauvin. Expect this to be very fruity.

Iron Pier, Gravesend, Kent

K77. Summer Fruits Berries & Cream 3.2% Packed with real strawberries not puree. with additional blackberries and raspberries. Smooth and full bodied but only 3.2%

K78. Keller Queen Lager 4.4% Germanic lager style beer.

From the Wave 6.2% West Coast IPA style. Big and juicy with pine & citrus flavours

K79. Islay Imperial Stout 8.5% Aged in old whisky barrels for 6 months imparting a slight smoky character K80. Barley Wine Moscatel (Barrel Aged) 8.7% A barley wine with vast amount of Goldings hops made to an old Truman's recipe. Aged for 2 years in Muscatel barrels the result is a hugely complex, oaky, fruit cake of a beer. MASSIVE

Left Handed Giant, Bristol K81. 100% Entertainment 6.4% IPA K82. The Holy Trinity 9.0% Mexican chilli and chocolate stout

Lervig, Stavanger, Norway

K83. Toasted Maple Stout 12% Sledgehammer beer we have learnt to expect from the Stavanger headbangers. An Imperial Stout brewed with Maple syrup, vanilla lots of dark roasted toasty malts and a bit of lactose for the finishing touch. Insane

Lost & Grounded, Bristol

K84. Hells Lager 4.4% Helles uses the same pilsner malt blend as Keller Pils, and is gently hopped with Magnum, Perle and Tettnang. Unfiltered and vegan friendly.

Mongozo, Melle, Belgium

K85. Pils 5.0% (Gluten Free) Golden yellow. Slightly bitter, 'hoppy' flavour. Easy drinking. The beer is brewed using only high-grade, certified-organic barley and hops.

Moretti, Udine, Italy

K86. Moretti L'Authentica 4.6% Luigi Moretti's "Beer and ice factory" was founded in Udine in 1859 the same year as the Royal Victoria Patriotic Building was built. Distributed in the UK by Heineken.

Neon Raptor, Nottinghamshire K87. Clusters 5.2% Peanut and Chocolate stout K88. Naughty Luggage 6.8% New England IPA

Redemption, Tottenham, London N.17

K89. Solar 4.2% Solar is the new keg beer. Vibrant Pale Ale is generously dry hopped with a fruity combination of Amarillo, Idaho 7, Cascade and El Dorado. A lovely pale gold in colour, with zesty citrus flavours and a refreshing hint of apricot.

K90. Rhinelander 4.2% Kolsch style lager. Bright gold colour, the aroma of spice, honey and floral aromas. The mouthfeel is medium-light with a malt dryness at the end. Brewed with Halltertau hops, giving a flavour of pear drops backed up with hop spiciness and a fruity sweetness from the traditional Kolsch yeast.

Sloop Brewery East Fishkil, New York, USA

K91. Juice Bomb 6.5% The low bitterness and late hopping showcase the citrusy, juicy notes of American hops. A blast of tropical aroma is followed by a resiny and balanced flavour. Juice bomb features all the aspects and nuances of full hop flavour — not just bitterness. An IPA for real hop lovers.

Tiny Rebel, Wales

K92. Electric Boogaloo 4.5% Back off Boogaloo a massive solo hit from Ringo Starr in 1971. This too is a massive hit of passion fruit and should have you up out off your seat and onto the dance floor...

K93. Craft 313 Lager 4.6% Tiny Rebels first craft lager. Bitter, pine, hoppy & floral

K94. Caramel Spiced Pineapple IPA 5.0% Hazy. Caramelised pineapple & vanilla. Rich caramelised candied pineapple with rum spices, vanilla, cinnamon and Kola nuts.

K95. Cookie Dough Biscuit Mix Millionaire Shortbread 8.0% Hazy. Chocolate & caramel, biscuits, chocolate & caramel. Packing a doughy, chocolatey punch, this is what happens when you add 1000's of biscuits and a shed load of chocolate to a beer.

K96. Limoncello Double IPA 8.5% Hazy. Sweet & Sour Lemon.

K97. Coffee & Popcorn Slow Dip Stout 10.0% Dark Espresso & Cinema Popcorn. Strong coffee and fresh popcorn are mixed in this slow fermented stout. Belgian Chocolate, Welsh Popcorn & Extract Coffee. MUST TRY

Westmalle, Antwerp, Belgium

The Trappist Abbey of Westmalle, near Antwerp, has been brewing beer for over 150 years. One of only 10 breweries in the world permitted to carry the Authentic Trappist Product label, it is regarded as being responsible for the increasing popularity of Trappist beers.

K98. Westmalle Dubbel 7.0% Outstanding Trappist beer. Rich and complex. This dark brown Belgian dubbel has beautiful ruby undertones with a creamy, fragrant head. Aromas of dark fruits, bread, and subtle spices lead the way for flavours of raisins and other dark fruits and a fresh bitter finish that lingers long and dry.
