CASK BAR

4t's Brewery, Warrington, Cheshire

Elvis Peachly 4.6% Peach fruit aroma with similar sweet taste. smooth and easy drinking

Mango Fever 4.6% Mango IPA. Feeling fruity? Get this down yer neck

By the Horns, Wimbledon London SW19

Stiff Upper Lip This was the first beer brewed. It has been tweaked since its inception. A light, soft, bready, malt backbone, with tropical citrus hop notes shining through with a hit of bitterness on the finish. Cascade, Centennial & Citra Hops

Green Hop Monster 4.5% Light and delicate pale ale with fresh green Golding hops from Hukins hops in Kent. The freshly picked hops offer a grassy, floral and gentle honey notes to well rounded pale ale with a light bitter finish

Blue Bird 4.5% - A bright golden body that paves the way for a fresh citrus and fruity hoppy ale with a nicely balanced bitterness. A perfect sessionable ale, lower bitterness, with hints of melon and white grape

Oktoberfest 4.8% - A special one off version of a casked munich helles for Oktoberfest. Incredibly smooth as you would imagine, gentle bready and sweet vanilla malts with a touch of floral German hops and restrained bitterness

Lambeth Walk 5.1% London is the true home of the Porter beer style. Chocolate, coffee roasted malt notes with dark berry shining through. big Was launched in 2012 and not stopped winning awards

Cloudwater, Manchester

Founded in 2014, This cutting edge Manchester brewer has in their short history made hundreds of different beers in styles old and new, classical and imagined, evolving their brewing skills and trialling fermentation and process changes in pursuit of ever higher-quality beer.

Happy 3.4% Modern, low-ABV Pale Ale Bright, fresh hop aromatics are allied with a smooth body and a finish that's dry but juicy. **VEGAN**

Meadow 3.0% Table Beer with all the depth you'd expect from a higher abv pale, Citra & Motueka work in tandem to provide bright tropical flavours with a lingering citrus finish.

Piccadilly Gold The next in our release of classic cask is Piccadilly Gold. Another personal favourite of the brewery, perfect for Friday night pints after a long week.

Piccadilly Gold 4.0% This straw-coloured golden ale features bright Citra hops that are balanced with a delicate malt base.

Dark Revolution, Salisbury, Wiltshire

Velveteen 4.8% Chocolate Milk Stout. Silky smooth oats, organic cacao nibs and lactose sugar come together to generate a very drinkable milk stout.

Where's My Dog 5.5% An new ESB with no tasting notes at time of going to press

Downton Salisbury, Wiltshire

Long time supplier to the Wandsworth Common Festival Martin Strawbridge is at the forefront of modern cask brewing and has stayed loyal to cask preferring not to go down the route of keg like so many other brewers. Instead, his ever changing seasonal range, plus core favourites, remain faithful to traditional beer production methods and techniques.

Honey Blonde 4.3% Straw coloured golden ale. Fresh and fruity infused with real honey

Moonstruck 5.5% Dark ruby ale with subtle coffee and chocolate flavours and a rich, hoppy aroma. Roasted berry and caramel characters sink deep into a fantastic bitter finish.

Chocolate Orange 5.8% A long time festival favourite and previous winner of "Best in Wandsworth" Enriched with a bottle of Cointreau in every brew

Durham Brewery, Bowburn. Co. Durham

Dark Angel 4.3% Drinks much bigger than 4.3%. A robust and full-bodied stout with coffee roast bitterness and rich caramel notes. Seven different grains including oats create a complex malt body. This is balanced by good old English hops.

Elephant School Brewery, Essex

Elephant School Brewing is named after the Elephant School that was in the Essex Regiment army barrack, which was a depot for the Essex Regiment. The school was run by the British East India Trading Company and ran until 1959.

Get Jiggy Wit It 4.6% Pale strawberry colour. A Belgian Wit/American IPA style. Wheaty and malty with a hint of real strawberries

Godalming Beer Works, Surrey

Brewing started at The Star on Church street in Godalming, the site of a tavern since 1832 it remains largely unaltered with all its 'Olde Worlde' character and charm. Highly recommended as a day out

Ravenscroft Best 4.1% Ravenscroft was the name given to the location where the first brew took place. A secret location in Godalming where if you time it right on a summer evening you can still spot the occasional Raven overhead.

Wey to Amarillo 4.5% Blonde ale

Waggon & Horses 5.0% A copper coloured ale

Pepperpot Porter 6.7% The Pepperpot is one of Godalming's most iconic landmarks, right in the middle of the town. New visitors often wonder why such a strangely shaped building exists. The current building was erected in 1814 and has served as the Town hall as well as the home for the weekly market. Includes coconut and vanilla in the recipe to create a porter that is rich but smooth. **MUST TRY**

Scary Mary 6% Strong Old Ale brewed with black treacle. Hopped with Pilgrim and East Kent Goldings. Rich and warming and perfect for a windy autumn. Named after Mart Toft born in Godalming in 1701 and became the subject of controversy when she convinced doctors she had given birth to several rabbits.

Good Chemistry Brewing, Bristol

Endless Summer 3.8% Columbus hops bring delicious lemon sherbet notes, combined with experimental hop HBC-735 to boost that sweet citrus flavour finishing with melon, floral notes and a crisp, clean bitterness. Golden Promise malted barley, Wheat and Vienna malt gives this beer a perfectly smooth base to let those hops shine. Smooth body, subtle honey, and light bready notes.

Full Circle 4.1% Full Circle is a full-bodied hazy pale ale, generously hopped with Citra, Comet, and Denali Full Circle is a full-bodied hazy pale ale. Generously hopped with Citra, Comet, and Denali. Providing you with citrus and grapefruit flavour and aroma at session strength,

Idaho Smash 4.8% An American IPA

Harveys, Lewes, Sussex

The oldest independent brewery in Sussex. A family business, the brewery has been in the guardianship of seven generations of John Harvey's descendants since 1790, with five family members from the seventh and eighth generations currently working here.

Still a privately-owned limited company, Harvey's remarkably has no shares marketed for external investment.

Dark Mild 3.0% Malty and Mellow. Soft and slightly sweet with a dry, nutty aftertaste akin to an infusion of ground nuts. Dark Mild accounted for 75% of beer produced during the decade following the Second World War and was the mainstay of a generation in the public bar. But today few breweries produce a top flight dark mild. Thankfully, Harveys brew this all year round making it one of the very few regularly produced Milds in the South of England

Old 4.3% Soft and full-bodied, with hints of dried fruits and dates. Rich, dark and warming. Available only in the autumn and winter months.

Southdown Harvest 5.0% Three types of hop and three different malts culminate on the palate providing soft, sweet biscuit flavours offset with a tangy bitterness from the 'green' hops.

Star of Eastbourne 5.5% This golden IPA exudes a full hop aroma, with subtle hints of marmalade. The crisp bitterness lingers on the palate giving a dry finish. What good IPA should taste like before it got influenced by US versions.

Prince of Denmark 7.5% One of the great beers of the World and rarely available on draught even in Harveys tied houses. A strong, dark beer of great complexity and depth. Brown, amber and black malts are mixed with pale ale malts to give this beer its strong aroma and colouring.

MUST TRY

Hopback, Salisbury, Wiltshire

Winter Lightning 5.5% Classic winter warmer. Brewed with Fuggles and East Kent Goldings hops, Winter Lightning is very lightly spiced and deceptively drinkable.

Leatherbriches, Ashby de la Zouche, Leicestershire

Mad Ruby 4.4% Ruby red colour Light malty aroma with a bitter hoppy kick near the finish. Black cherry and bourbon biscuit in the aftertaste

Left Handed Giant, St.Philip's, Bristol

Bookshop Pale 4.2% Brewed in collaboration with The Old Bookshop to celebrate their 2nd Birthday! Simple, classic cask beer showcasing Citra hops - utilising Citra T90, Cryo and

Incognito formats to create a full and rounded expression. Notes of lychee, elderflower and the tropics!

Magpie Brewery, Ashland Court, Nottinghamshire

Cherry Raven 4.4% Dark cherry stout with smokey aftertaste. Dark and creamy

Milestone, Cromwell, Newark

Hoptimism 3.4% Extra pale ale made with Citra hops

Lion's Pride 3.8% Copper coloured

Cathedral Gold 4.3% A fruity and aromatic extra pale ale

North Riding Brewery, Scarborough, North Yorkshire

Pistachio Porter 4.5% Porter using five malts, with demerara sugar and English Bramling hops. Infused post fermentation with Pistachio flavouring.

Chocolate & Toffee Porter 4.5% Porter using six malts and English hops. Full bodied with a toffee aftertaste.

Sambrook's, Wandsworth London SW18

What can you say about this wonderful brewer who started as Young's left us. Then lost their Yelverton Road brewery to developers only to be offered the Heritage Brewery site on the old Young's site. Truly a Phoenix from the ashes story. Once again John Hatch has produced a memorable one off for this festival only. Plus 3 different Imperial Stouts

Junction 4.5% Named with a nod to our local train station Junction is a rich, premium ale. Sweeter than Wandle it is brewed with Maris otter Pale and a dose of crystal and roasted barley with Challenger, Goldings and Bramling X hops. There is now a good reason to go Up the Junction.

Pumphouse Pale Ale 4.2% Pumphouse Pale Ale is named after the local landmark in Battersea Park. An English style Pale Ale with a balanced sweetness and hop character, late hopped with Wakatua to give a pleasant floral, and light spice aroma. An updated version of the classic English Pale Ale.

Powerhouse Porter 4.9% Powerhouse Porter is a classic example of London-style porter. Rich with dark chocolate, aromas of coffee and smoke and a smooth toasted finish.

Leader of the House 6.0% This according to John Hatch is his first winter brew of the year. A one-off in our series of politically named beers following from last years Councillor. Exceptional **MUST TRY**

Imperial Stout 10.2% Supplied in a 36 pint pin and is the last available for the brewery so get while you can

Imperial Stout (Version 2) 10.2% -Imperial Stout aged on cacao nibs and toasted coconut flakes.

Laphroaig Barrel aged Imperial Stout 10.2% Aged in whiskey barrel

Southwark Brewery, London SE.1

Bankside Blonde 3.8% Refreshing easy drinking pint. Light gold colour. 100% Mosaic hops

Potters Field Porter 4.0% Session London Porter. dark beer with a malty body with hint of coffee and liquorice

Red Routemaster 4.2% brewed with 100% redX malt which delivers a chestnut coloured beer with a red hue. smooth tropical fruit finish.

Ariana 5.0% The daughter of Hercules. Sweet berry and passion fruit aromas. A positively fruit cocktail of flavours, pineapple, tangerine, lime, quince, strawberry and blackberry

Titanic, Burslem, Stoke on Trent, Staffordshire

Started back in the eighties when Lord Battersea came across the brewery while going to an away match Spurs game at Stoke. At the time, there were very few small brewers and it felt like we were sailing into uncharted waters. The brewery has gone from strength to strength and now produces 4 million pints annually. Always the first to run out at festivals we have 3 casks for Wandsworth

Iceberg 4.1% Brewed first in 1993, this beer has a high percentage of wheat in the grist and was one of the first UK beers to use US hop varieties. Gold, refreshing, well-rounded session pale. Soft fruity yet malty aromas with a slightly sweet taste on the palate

White Star 4.5% White Star is a strong, golden ale with a uniquely crisp taste and aroma created in part by adding Summit hops late in the fermenting process. A distinctive crisp and hoppy gold beer with fruit tastes on the palate and scent.

Cherry Porter 4.9% Brewed as a sister beer to the famous Plum Porter this lightly hopped, dark red, fruity beer is powerful. The sweet cherry cuts through and is reminiscent to a cherry bakewell tart! A well rounded fruity porter, hoppy with notes of sweet cherry.

Plum Porter 4.9% Plum Porter the famous best selling, strong, dark porter that has re-defined the sector. By combining the sweetness of plums with the hoppy flavour of a porter. Many brewers have attempted this style but none have pulled it off with such success as Titanic A well-rounded porter with f, sweet plummy notes over a backdrop of hoppy beer. **MUST TRY**

India Pale Ale 4.5% Gold with white head. There is a flowery, perfumed character to this. Notes of white grapes, it becomes quite resinous through the beer, increasingly bitter. Pithy grapefruit notes.

Captain Smith 5.2% Captain Smith's is a strong, traditional ruby ale named after one of the most famous sea captains of all time. Captain Edward Smith skippered the Titanic and was born in Stoke on Trent.

A deep, softly hopped, strong ruby ale. The malty flavours and aromas are twinned with a gentle sweetness.

Thornbridge, Bakewell, Derbyshire

The Thornbridge story began back in 2005 when the founders Jim Harrison and Simon Webster recruited two young brewers to brew on a second hand 10-barrel kit in the grounds of Thornbridge Hall. In 2009 a brand new state of the art brewery was built at Riverside, Bakewell to meet with demand and allow Thornbridge to develop their range of beers. Brewing still takes place today on the original kit which has been moved to beside the Taproom at Riverside, which allows them to experiment with new brews, create bespoke Hall brews, collaborations and assist the main brewery in Bakewell.

The 4 beers below are limited release collaborations ONLY available at the this festival

Colmore Mild 6.5% A dark mild brewed in collaboration with the Colmore in Birmingham and Pivovar. Colmore Mild is hopped with a traditional blend of Fuggles and Goldings to balance the slightly sweet finish.

Kashpur 5.7% An IPA made in collaboration with Salopian. An attempt to merge Salopian's Kashmir with Thornbridge's Jaipur. There is a plethora of citrus fruit, hints of pine and the lingering dry finish both beers are renowned for.

Market Cat Export Porter 7.0% Rich strong chocolate flavours.

Gold Label 9.9% The result of a collaboration with Kelham Island in order to recreate the classic golden barley wine. Could be the beer of the Festival **MUST TRY**

Pachamama 8.5% Imperial brown ale with Spanish honey. Pachamama is a divine brown ale, created with the addition of rich Spanish honey, enhancing the beer with floral notes and a light sweetness. Barrel aged in Pedro Ximénez (sweet sherry) barrels. The beer is aged for 9 months to give a beautiful consonance with the sherry, with flavours of raisins, candied fruits and hints of dark chocolate all interacting for a complex beer. **MUST TRY**

Unbarred, Brighton, Sussex

Established in 2014 from the shed of founder and Head Brewer Jordan Mower. Born of a passion to brew uncompromising and exciting beer. They soon outgrew the shed and moved onto gypsy brewing, enabling them to grow production and hone their craft, working together with other fabulous breweries.

Since establishing a taproom and brewery in the heart of Brighton in August 2019, they have quadrupled production and embraced the Brighton community

Old Ale 6.3% A dark & seasonal Old Ale made from the second runnings of Stoutzilla & enriched with sweet black treacle.

The result is a complex dark ale, with plenty of roasted malt character and dried fruits. Soft and full-bodied, Old Ale exhibits hints of raisin, red grape, and dates.

Old Ale is brewed using the Parti-gyle brewing method - a technique for making more than one beer from runnings of a single mash. This method, while old (it's been around for 100's of years!) is still used in this country today – sometimes creating 3 different beers from the same grains! With Old Ale, rather than letting the grains from Stoutzilla go to waste, more brewing water was added to extract the residual sugars and create a second wort. Then a sweet black treacle, England's answer to molasses, was added to bring depth and complexity.

Verdant Brewing, Penryn, Wales

Penpol 3.8% An American IPA single hop Citra

Argal 4.4% A clean and crisp golden ale with added Munich malt . Bitter finish with notes of orange, mango, grapefruit and ganja.

Vibrant Forest, Hardley nr. Southampton, Hampshire

A small brewery located in the New Forest National Park. all their beers are unfiltered, unpasteurised and suitable for Vegans

Kaleidoscope

Black Forest Porter 4.9% Very rich, thick, and flavoursome porter, in the style of those brewed in old London. The aroma brings roasted coffee and oak. Dark chocolate, espresso and charred malts follow and the long finale is dark, fruity, and bittersweet. **MUST TRY**

Inaudible 5.0% Hazy pale ale with an oat-laden base plus Chinook, Simcoe and Talus hops Fermented on their house yeast, expect a soft mouthfeel with hints of pine, stone fruits and a gentle herbaceous finish.

Wantsum Brewery, relocated to St. Nicholas Court Farm, Wade, Kent

The brewery was founded by 2 long serving but disgruntled Greene King employees who have gone from strength to strength with a policy of core beers and a very wide (maybe too wide) range of specials and seasonals. Highly recommended. Wantsum Brewery takes its name from the Wantsum Channel, the watercourse separating the Isle of Thanet from what was the mainland of the English county of Kent.

Mores Head 3.7% A Light Hoppy Session Bitter, Named after Sir Thomas More whose decapitated head is believed to have been stolen by his sister and hidden in the Roper family vault in St Dunstan's Church". A chestnut coloured Bitter providing malt and roasted grains balanced by fruit and floral hop bitterness with a hint of citrus

Hurricane 4.5% New World IPA brewed with Mosaic & Citra Hops. Oats in the Mash give a smooth mouthfeel and plenty of body to the Beer.

Black Pig 4.8% Adapted from an imperial Russian porter recipe, this beer is incredibly smooth with burnt chocolate and smoky malt notes mixed with delicate hop bitterness and floral notes.

Grim Reaper 5.5% A red rye IPA, perfectly named for this festival but actually available all year round.

Golgotha 5.5% Oatmeal stout. A rich, deep and broad malt base gives this stout a very long smooth finish with plenty of oats for added body and creaminess. Hops are prominent on the nose with blackcurrant, liquorice and cedar.

Ravening Wolf 5.9% The nickname given to Odo, Earl of Kent and half brother of William the Conqueror who was tried for defrauding the crown. A strong New Zealand pale Ale. Toasted biscuit and rye malt flavours support a pine lemon hop crispness with a hint of vanilla

White Rose Brewery, Sheffield, South Yorkshire

Stairlift to Heaven 4.2% Pale gold colour. Lemon sherbet hoppiness. We are stocking this purely on the basis of the fabulous name.

Wylam Brewery, Newcastle Upon Tyne, Tyne & Wear

Founded in 2000 Wylam is a 30 Barrel Micro Brewery that resides at the Palace of Arts in Exhibition Park.

Fleck 4.2% Citra and Amarillo hops give a fresh citrus zest palate with a soft peach fruit finish

Gold 4.0% Brewed with all gold ingredients - Golden Promise Pale Malt, Golden Naked Oats, First Gold Hops, with a Willamette hop finish. Fresh, clean flavour with a hint of grapefruit citrus from the Willamette.

The KEG Bar

The beers will rotate throughout the festival

Armadillo Ale Works, Denton, Texas, USA

Every drop of Armadillo Ale Works beer is brewed on-site, housed in an old railway grain warehouse constructed in the early 1900s. Began as a couple of guys in a garage with some homebrew equipment and a hand-full of recipes.

Founders Yianni Arestis and Bobby Mullins started Armadillo Ale Works back in 2010 with a dream of opening a craft brewery in Denton, TX. Their journey from conception to fruition was long and unconventional, but after 8 years, the brewery finally opened its doors in 2018.

Land Yacht 4.2% West Coast IPA with grapefruit, mango and pineapple flavours. A boat load of hops.

Scrappy Boy 4.2% American Cream Ale. Because so many Americans actually think Bud (the nearest thing to an empty glass), Miller (total crap beer made with adjuncts and Coors (nearer water than beer) are acceptable as beer. This was brewed to show what lager should actually taste like.

Armadillo Amber 5.0% An Altbier brewed in the style of the original Craft beers from the US before they went mad with over hopping

Idiots Hill 9.0% American Strong Ale Named after a district of Denton, Texas. Think of it as an Imperial Red Ale

Quaker Town 9.5% Imperial Oatmeal Stout. award winning USA beer flavours of dark chocolate, roasted pecans and roasted malt

Brunch Money 10% Imperial Golden Stout. This difficult to brew beer is only made once annually primarily because it is so difficult plus very expensive to brew. Entirely unique style attempting to deceive the eyes and palate. It is a high alcohol blonde ale but has the flavour of a stout. The result is a rich light coloured with intense coffee, chocolate, and vanilla flavours beer. **MUST TRY**

Drop Project, Mitcham, Surrey

An Eco conscious brewery, who attempt to create as little a negative impact on the world as possible when brewing. Spent grain is recycled into local agricultural as animal feed and they have reduced CO2 usage

in the brewery by 90%. They have a one tree one brew policy, where Drop Project commit to planting a tree for every batch brewed. At their Mitcham Taproom, every 100 pints you drink, they plant one tree

Shifty 5.2% Flagship pale ale

Glassy Bohemian Pilsner 5.8% Made with the finest German Malts. Fermented cold, its smooth with subtle hints of fruit and spice. Medium to light body with a hint of initial sweetness finished with a clean crisp bitter finish you would expect from an 80 day lagered Pilsner

Strike Lager 4.2% Brewed with a complex blend of choice pilsner malts as well as Hallertau Mittlefruh & Saaz hops. Fermented cold, it's smooth with subtle hints of fruit and spice. Medium to light body with a super clean crisp finish.

Voyager 12% Imperial Stout. Weighing in at 12%, it's the strongest beer at this festival. Unashamedly strong with hints of vanilla, coconut and black treacle. With Chinook as the bittering hop, the main players for this beer all come from the roasted barley, chocolate malt,

caramalt and tonnes of oats to give thick, sweet Caramel and roasty notes on the nose and tongue. 100% vegan friendly.

Iron Pier, Gravesend, Kent

Barley Wine 8.7% A true barley wine aged for 2 years in Muscatel barrels. Made with vast amounts of Goldings hops from man old Truman recipe. Hugely complex, oaky, fruit cake beer.

Manhattan Project, Dallas, Texas, USA

As with most craft beer businesses, Manhattan Project Beer Company began as a passionate hobby. Three partners came together in 2010 to create a beer for a wedding.

After an 8-month design period, the project proved to be a success. Their creative, collaborative, experimental, and scientific approach to beer making made the name Manhattan Project applicable. This really is like rocket fuel.

Red Gate 5.4% Beautiful red coloured bock style perfect with a burger

Necessary Evil 5.3% Dry and crisp Pilsner lager

Plutonium 239 6.2% Coconut Porter The beer for you if you are into the chocolate and coconut flavours of a Bounty Bar

Wise Monkeys 10% A Belgian strong golden ale. Aroma of fermented stone fruits like peach

Neon Raptor, Sneiton Market, Nottinghamshire,

"The best brewery in Nottingham. Consistently knocking out of the park with the range and quality of their brews. Cannot recommend enough."

Not the Bees (Wicker Man) 4.2% New England pale ale

Nightmare Before Clusters 5.2% Peanut and Chocolate stout

Don't Look Now 8.2% Cherry, chocolate and pomegranate sour

Oak Highlands Brewery, Dallas, Texas, USA

Golden Moustache 5.5% A Dortmund lager style

Texas Pecan Ale 6.2% Amber coloured award winning brown ale made with Texan pecans

Derelict IPA 6.1% West Coast IPA style. 5 separate hop additions. Strong citrus hop aroma and flavor without an overly bitter taste.

Freaky Deaky 10% A Texas take on a Belgian Trippel.

White Wine Freaky Deaky 10% The same Belgian triple but this time aged for 6 months in old white wine barrels.

Phantom Brewing, Reading Berks

A Little TLC 5.0% Hops: Cashmere, Sabro & Citra hops. Layers of ripe honeydew melon, zingy tangerine, lime and a subtle creamy coconut finish.

Boundary 6.8% Simcoe & Citra hops. Tastes of apricot, pine resin and juicy mango.

Nectaron 8.0% A double IPA from their single hop series showcasing the full aroma and flavour of each hop, these beers exhibit the hop characteristics to their full potential.

Revolve 8.4% Mosaic, Citra & Amarillo. Sweet, floral notes, paired with orange peel and a bitter finish.

Sambrooks, Wandsworth London, SW18

Pagoda Pilsner 4.5% A classic take of a German Pilsner brewed in Wandsworth by Sambrook's Brewery. First brewed in 2021 in celebration of Sambrook's moving to their new brewery in Wandsworth on part of the old Young's Ram Brewery. Classically clear, light and grassy this is a perfect crisp and clean, easy drinking, thirst quencher.

Turning Point Brewery, Bedford, Texas, USA

Backstreet Boys 6.8% German style Bock amber lager

You'll Never Drink Alone 6.0% A Red Ale made in the Irish style

Diamond Dogs 5.0% A light to medium bodied Vienna Style Lager

Left Handed Giant - Woodland Creatures, Honeycomb & Pistachio Stout 6.9% With a silky smooth mouthfeel, soft roasted malt character and the tasty combo that is Honeycomb and Pistachio, Woodland Creatures has drinkability and decadence all at once!

Not suitable for vegans
